OUR MISSION

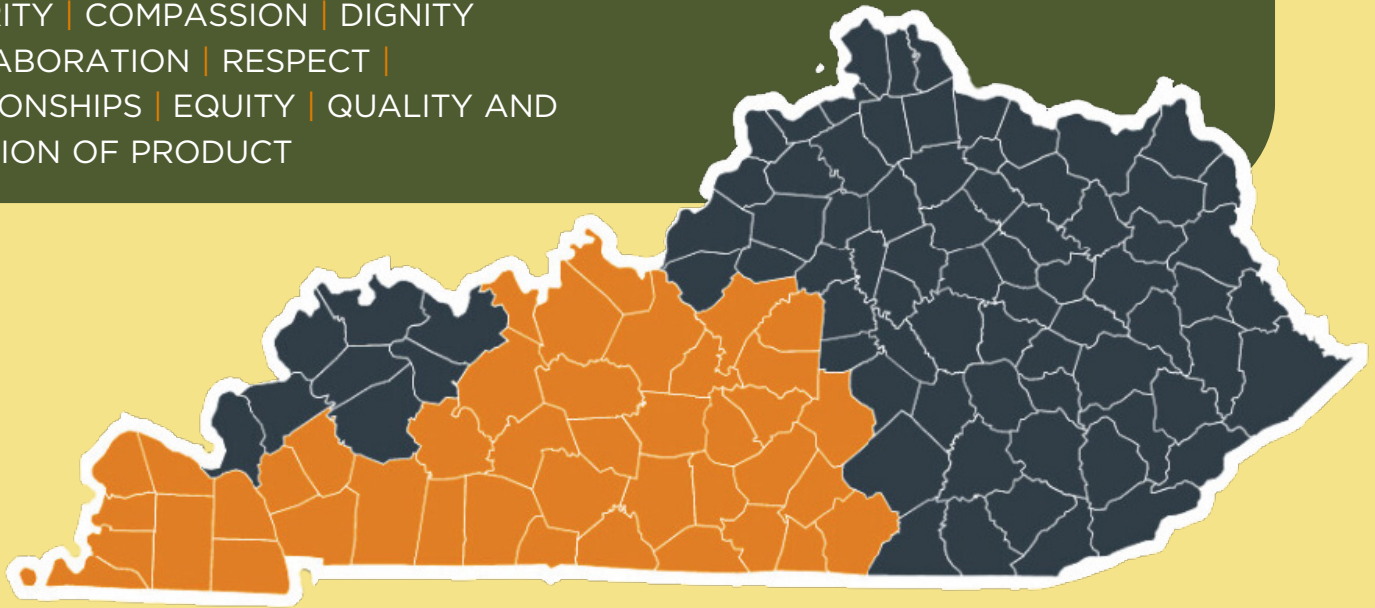
Feeding America, Kentucky's Heartland gathers and distributes food in 42 Kentucky counties to feed our neighbors in need through local community partnerships.

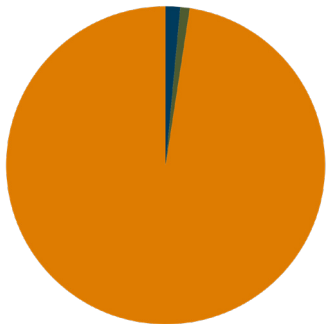

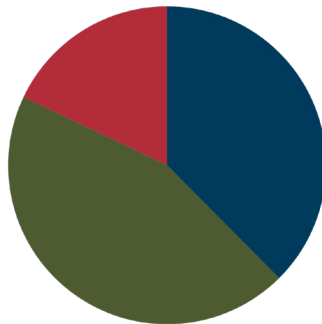
FUNDING BREAKDOWN

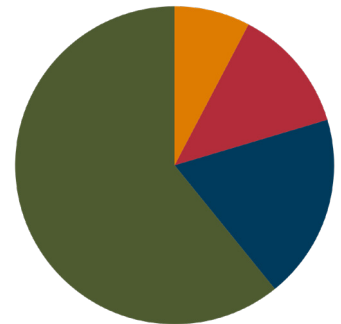
